Further to our meeting on 21 July 2021 with regards to the Ash Ranges Technical Area (TA), I wanted to write again in respect of the impact of vandalism on the site, on cost and training.

The figures set out below have been carefully reviewed to strip out costs related to vandalism on Ash Ranges not specific to the TA. These figures therefore relate solely to the TA (including its perimeter fencing). The figures are from 2017, prior to which we have no recorded incidents of vandalism in the TA.
